

- who lack health awareness and health practice


by providing them medical care, health education, material, financial and technical support.




# Our Challenges

- Legal status

- Border crossing due to conflicts or hard-to-reach places due to poor road conditions, especially during the rainy season
- COVID-19 Vaccinations
- Referral cases in general and emergencies
- Difficulties in the follow-up of chronic diseases
- Difficulties in ANC screening on the Burmese side

# Mother and Childcare Project (MCHC)

#### Antenatal Care (ANC)

Antenatal care is essential for protecting the health of women and their unborn children. Through this form of preventive health care, women can learn from our skilled health care workers about healthy behaviors during pregnancy, better understand warning signs during pregnancy and childbirth, and receive social, emotional and psychological support at this critical time in their lives.







# Safe Delivery

We help pregnant women with our experience and advice to prepare for the upcoming birth.





## Baby Bonding Workshops



- Providing half day workshop for the new mother and pregnant women for 7 communities
- BTS training for different groups and touch rules for students.

#### Medical Outreach (MO)







Outreach programs in remote areas are sometimes challenging, especially during the rainy season due to poor access and road conditions





We visit 14 communities every month in the border area, provide basic medical care & treatment, early detection for emergency cases and chronic diseases.

#### Our activities:

- 1. Health Education
- 2. Mobile clinics
- 3. Simple chronic care
- 4. Hospital referral if needed
- 5. Medical fee and other fee supports if needed
- 6. Nutrition support for chronic patients
- 7. Social welfare

#### Chronic Care

#### CC type 1

Simple cases of HBP, Asthma, Epilepsy, etc.

The patient can't get access to the hospital either isolate or other reason:

#### Activities:

- Consultation & simple treatment
- Health education and ensure they take the treatment properly
- Social welfare support if needed
- When the expatriate doctor arrives, we consult the patients and get the suggestion from time to time

#### CC type 2

Mainly referral cases as TB, HIV/AIDS, Epilepsy, Diabetes, etc.

#### Activities :

- Consult and refer
- Ensure, the case get appropriated treatment
- Ensure they take the treatment properly and they go for appointment regularly
- Help for transport if really needed
- Food or others if needed
- Contributions for the treatment cost, if needed

## Medical support for chronic patients

Patients with chronic health problems require special long-term care.



## Health Education in Schools

- Health education
- Providing first aid kits
- Health screening
- TOT for teacher on health
- Provision of hygiene packages and sanitary material
- Life skills training for teenage Students
- Hygiene and sanitation campaign
- Health and social discussions in parenting





## Health Education





#### Nursery School Program

We work in kindergartens in Mon and Karen villages, offering children the opportunity to learn more and develop their skills.

Parents usually have little time for this because they either work for the family's livelihood or for the community.

We provide

- Teacher salaries
- Teaching materials
- Nutrition
- TOT
- Health education
- Health Screening
- Hygiene supplies
- EMS first aids boxes



# Primary School Support

We support 970 children in 8 schools

- Teaching materials

- Dental care 2 times per year
- Health screening

#### Child Protection






- Looking for shelter for abused children
